PREVIOUS PROJECTS



Like much of the world, 2020 was an unprecedented year in Northern Uganda. The rainy season didn't seem to end and COVID-19 brought about additional challenges. In the face of these challenges, the first harvest for NUSSP persisted. NUSSP was able to harvest the sesame (above) and corn (below). The sale of the harvest is pending market price adjustments and the land is being prepared for the next planting season, which will occur in April 2021.

As part of the planting efforts, NUSSP provided six, one-acre plots to the community for land preparation and use. In exchange, the community provided 10% of their crop to NUSSP.



NUSSP

The Northern Uganda Self-Sufficiency Project (NUSSP) is ready to begin its first livestock initiative. NUSSP is hopeful this Pig Farming Project will be the first of many livestock/animal programs. NUSSP is working with Lift Up Uganda to help fundraise for Father Simon Menya and this pig farming project. Once the pigs are grown, the pigs will be sold and profits will be used to reinvest in the pig farm operation, feed the needy, and to explore future projects.



PIG FARMING PROJECT

This project will provide for modern pig farming in Northern Uganda. In the first nine (9) months, NUSSP plans to tour successful pig farms, build pig pens, hire a Pig Keeper, provide housing to the Pig Keeper, hire an on-call veterinarian, obtain food and medication for the pigs, and purchase 20 piglets.

Projected Costs

- * Piglet purchase price: \$70/pig
- Pig Keeper salary for one (1) year: \$900
- Cost of food and medicine for all pigs for one (1) year: \$3,400
- Cost to build pig pens: \$750/pen (projected goal: 16 pens)
- Cost to build Pig Keeper Housing/ Storeroom: \$4,800
- * Cost to set up site operations: \$3,600


